I completed the Bachelor of Optometry in 2007 at the University of Melbourne. My graduate job was at a well esteemed contact lens practice Richard Lindsay and Associates in Melbourne.

In 2013 I became Victorian President of the Cornea and Contact Lens Society, a position I still hold to this date. I also served as National President of the same society in 2014-16.

In 2014 I purchased Eyetech Optometrists from Russell Lowe, and in 2021 the business moved to larger premises and two consulting rooms. We are recognised for excelling in anterior eye and contact lens and garner many referrals for all speciality contact lens fits, including all forms of irregular cornea - i.e. keratoconus, post-keratoplasty, post-surgical and post-injury. We are also a strong myopia control clinic - this clinic was the first to prescribe orthokeratology in Victoria in 1991 (of course before my time!). We also manage paediatric aphakes and take on 15-20 new babies or children each year.

In addition, I supervise in the University of Melbourne Student Clinic - teaching in the cornea clinic. I write a regular column for MiVision magazine - the largest print optics magazine in the southern hemisphere, and I am Lead Visionary for non-for-profit Sight For All's Contact lens projects and have been involved in missions to Vietnam and Cambodia to train local ophthalmologists in contact lenses.

I have also been awarded fellowships from the British Contact Lens Association, the Australian College of Optometry and the International Academy of Orthokeratology and Myopia Control.
